Remaining Flexible

Flexibility in early childhood education is key to helping children follow their interests, engaging them on multiple levels, and to planning and documenting effectively.

- 1. Flexibility emphasizes process over product. By allowing room for exploration, educators encourage a love of learning.
- 2. Flexibility encourages educators to follow children's interests. By following children's lead, educators allow children to remain engaged, curious citizens of the classroom and beyond.
- 3. Flexibility allows individualized instruction. Being open to children engaging with an activity or material in their own way affirms their sense of identity and autonomy.
