Fair Doesn't Mean Equal: Individualizing Supports for Children

Children are unique! Yet offering individualized supports for a child can be tricky. You might get questions like: "Why does Xavier get to sit on your lap?" "Why does Jamaica always get the pink fidget?" Remember: equity doesn't mean everyone gets the same thing. Equitable classrooms are places where it is safe for everyone to seek and receive what they need. Here are some ways to talk to curious kids about friends who need a little more of your attention sometimes:

- **Encourage empathy.** "Xavier is feeling sad today, so I'm giving him a hug until he feels better. That's what he needs right now" Even the youngest children will often respond with concern and gestures of friendliness.
- Address the feeling of injustice by pointing out everyone has different needs. "You don't need a fidget right now. This is what Jamaica needs right now."
- Encourage children to be helpers. "María looks upset. What can we do to help her feel better?"

Gardening with Young Children



September is harvest time at Epiphany Early Learning Center, where gardening is a core part of the curriculum. Spending time outdoors, digging in and feeling the soil, tasting a fresh tomato, smelling herbs... children benefit in so many ways. Nature soothes the nervous system, helping children regulate and relax. They learn about science and the natural world, move their bodies, learn and use new vocabulary, and collaborate together as they work on a shared task like planting new seeds or harvesting fresh vegetables. And of course, being a part of growing healthy food makes young children more interested in trying and tasting.

In Epiphany's greenhouse all children 12 months and older participate in weekly gardening sessions year round. Some produce even gets used by the school chef in the children's lunches! Families also have a chance to bring produce, and even seedlings, home.

You don't need a big outdoor space or a greenhouse to make gardening available to children. Poke some holes in the bottom of a plastic bin, fill with soil, and invite the children to plant seeds they find. What do you think will happen?
